Program Description

The program includes classroom instruction and clinical practice in adult health nursing, family health nursing, and mental health nursing

Application Deadline

Students applying for the Spring 2023 program must submit an application to the Limited Entry Office by September 1, 2022. A "Limited Entry Application for Admission to a Health Science Program" may be obtained online at: https://www.csn.edu/Limited-Entry-Admission.

Final grades or completed transcript evaluation must be in the Limited Entry Office by September 1, 2022, for the Spring 2023 class.

Accepted Students

Students accepted into the program will be required to show proof of CPR certification, health insurance, and immunization against Hepatitis B, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella, Tetanus, and Diphtheria. In addition, proof of a negative two-step TB test and negative urine drug screen will be required.



A physical examination must also be completed. An official background check is required. This documentation is due at the mandatory advising session held during the week before classes begin each semester.

Licensure as a Registered Nurse

All states require Registered Nurses to be licensed. To become licensed in the State of Nevada, you must have graduated from an approved school of professional nursing and passed the RN national licensing examination.

In addition to successfully completing the prescribed course of study in an approved school of nursing, the Nevada Nurse Practice Act (NRS 632.140) requires that candidates for licensure be (1) of good moral character and (2) in good physical and mental health. Prospective students are advised that if they have been convicted of a felony prior to admission to the program that this may preclude subsequent licensure to practice as a nurse in Nevada (NRS 632.320).
