

OPHTHALMIC DISPENSING

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Job Description

The mission of the Ophthalmic Dispensing program is to prepare graduates to be licensed opticians. The program consists of systematic instruction in all aspects of work in the profession. The program includes instruction and laboratory training in contact lens skills, eyewear dispensing skills, lens finishing techniques, lens surfacing, as well as in sales techniques, basic business operations and communications. Instructions in low vision aids, prosthetics, and physician assisting skills is also covered. The program curriculum is designed to assist the student to be successful with national certification and state licensure examinations.

Career Opportunities

Employment for ophthalmic dispensers (opticians) is expected to increase faster than the average for all occupations through the year 2025. An increase in demand for corrective lenses is expected due to growth in the population of middle-aged and older adults.

Program Description

The Ophthalmic Dispensing program at CSN is a two-year program of study leading to an Associate of Applied Science degree. The curriculum provides didactic and clinical or hands-on training. It offers the student the opportunity to become proficient in all phases of ophthalmic dispensing.

The Ophthalmic dispensing degree is a Limited-Entry Program. Therefore, all candidates must be met minimum eligibility criteria by the completion deadline in order to be eligible for consideration.

Application Deadline

Student applying for Fall 2021 program must submit an application to the Limited Entry Office by June 1, 2021. Final grades or transcript evaluation must be in the Limited Entry Office by June 1, 2021. Accepted Students

Students accepted into the program will be required to complete a clinical practicum. Depending on the clinical practicum site, students may be required to CPR certification, health insurance, and immunization against Hepatitis B, Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella, Tetanus, and Diphtheria. Proof of a negative two-step TB skin test and negative urine drug screen and completion of a physical

Licensure/Certification as Opticians in Nevada

Upon graduation from the program, individuals who wish to gain licensure as an optician in Nevada must; take the American Board of Opticianry Competency examinations, the examinations dictated by Nevada Board of Dispensing Opticians (NBDO). The National Contact Lens examinations, complete a one year apprenticeship, and take the state board exam. The one year apprenticeship can be completed while an individual is a student in the program. Information concerning state licensure may be obtained from the NBDO.
